Advent A Season of Expectation

The Season of Advent begins with our worship service on December 1. We will be sharing Holy Communion, decorating the sanctuary Christmas tree, and lighting the first candle on our advent wreath – the candle of *Hope*.

Advent services will continue in the weeks that follow, as we prepare for Christmas and anticipate the birth of the Christ child. Each week, we will lift up the themes of Advent. December 8 the coming of *Peace*, December 15 the *Joy* that Christ brings to the world, and December 22 the *Love* born to us on Christmas.

Chrístmas Eve December 24 ~ 6:00 PM

Then on Christmas Eve, we celebrate the coming of the Christ Child in our candlelight service. The Christ candle on our advent wreath will be lit, we will share holy communion, and hear the lessons and carols of the season. On this night, the Light overcomes the darkness!

Building Sale Update

In the last newsletter we told you that we were close to a closing date on the sale of the 98 East Ave. church building, with only the approval of the Attorney General still to be determined. Well, we have just received that approval, so everything is now ready for closing. Although we don't have an exact date yet, it should be very soon.

The buyer, Revolution Elite Wrestling Club, operates a sort of sports complex for kids. He has plans to expand with the possibility of basketball, baseball, and martial arts, as well as the wrestling. They operate as a non-profit, and seek to support the community of Lockport.

We will be holding a mortgage for 3 years for a portion of the purchase price, and will receive monthly payments.

While it is somewhat sad to see the old building pass from our hands, the sale will give us some financial relief and allow us to move forward in our new location.

for the children through the YWCA. New Toys for any age are accepted. Please do NOT wrap your toys.


Please bring in your toy and mitten donations by **December 22**, so we can deliver them in time for Christmas.

Growing up, one of my biggest fears was the dark. This fear of the darkness has followed me for most of my life, even into adulthood. This fear made it difficult for me to take my dog outside at night and made it difficult for me to go to work early because I did not know if there was anything or anyone outside near my vehicle (as you can imagine, I would run from the door to my car). My fear of the dark stems from not knowing what might be hidden in the darkness. But Church, it wasn't until recently that there was something that causes greater fear in me than what might be hidden in the darkness around me.

It turns out, I am more afraid of the darkness that might find its home within my heart and my soul. The darkness might find its home within me without my notice, without my awareness, and without my knowledge. It can happen when I begin to allow negativity, pessimism, and cynicism to take root within me. And when this happens, it changes how I see the world around me:

Instead of focusing on the positive, my eyes will fixate on the negative

Instead of focusing on hope, my eyes will fixate on fear

Instead of focusing on **compassion**, my eyes will fixate on hate

Instead of focusing on joy, my eyes will fixate on despair

Church, you might find yourselves less afraid of the darkness around you, and more afraid of the darkness that may find itself within you. If this is true for you, know you are not alone. It is a fear of your pastor, and of our spiritual ancestors in the Bible. Because of this, we must pay attention to what we consume in our lives – whether it is on social media, on our news stations, on the radio, in our literature, in our social commentary, or in our relationships.

Take care to minimize your consumption of negativity, of ideas or concepts intended to divide us instead of unite us, of media that tells half-truths or outright falsities, and of anything that dehumanizes and demonizes any person made in God's image (spoiler alert: that means everyone and anyone).

Take care to maximize your consumption of good news, of ideas and concepts that bring us together in unity, of media that tells the truth as objectively as possible, of voices that uplift love, kindness, and justice, of anything that works towards the common good of all people.

Take care to multiply the light in the world. Become so full of light that it shines all around you and from within you into the world around you. With so much light, the darkness disappears. This is true of the darkness in the world around us . . . and the darkness that might be dwelling within us.

Church, let us be the light

My prayer for you is that by being rooted and established in love, you may have the power to grasp how wide and long and high and deep is the love of Christ

(Ephesians 3:17-18)



Hidden within the hymn *Joy to the World* is a verse that explores the **wonder** of the width, length, height, and depth of God's love for us. Written by Isaac Watts in 1719, this hymn reflects on the good news of the birth of Jesus. And this good news elicits in us not only joy – but **wonder**. As someone who considers herself a lifelong learner, there are many things I have come to know about God. Yet there is something I can never fully comprehend about God and that is the width, length, height, and depth of God's love for us.

God's love for us is incomprehensible and incalculable, it is immeasurable and immense, and it is expansive and extraordinary. I cannot fully grasp and grapple with how God could love us so much. I wonder how it can be that God loves us, when we struggle to love ourselves. I wonder how it can be that God loves us, when we struggle to love one another. I wonder how it can be that God loves us, when we struggle with loving God in return. I wonder how it is possible for God to love us on our good days, let alone on our bad days. I wonder how it is possible for God to love us when we are at our best, let alone at our worst. I wonder how it is possible for God to love us no matter what we think, no matter what we say, and no matter what we do. I wonder how it is possible for God to love us as we are - not as we were in the past, not as we will be in the future, but just as we are in the present! God's love for us never changes . . . I wonder how that can be.

As the holiday season draws near, may you all be filled with wonder. Not wonder about the beauty of the falling snow or the captivating twinkling of the lights, but wonder about the width, length, height, and depth of God's love for us. God's love is beyond measure, beyond comprehension, and beyond our wildest imagination. Let us be filled with wonder this season, as we celebrate God's love for us in the birth of Jesus.

FAMILY VILLAGE FARM, INDIA

Family Village Farm is a home, community and school for children and adults without families and homes. Children and adults live and work together, creating a community that benefits all.

King's Matriculation School at the Family Village Farm has undergone major reconstruction in



recent years as additional needs are identified. The school serves 670 students and is one of Global Ministries' Child S p o n s o r s h i p Centers.

MEXICAN ROUNDTABLE

The roundtable of our Mexican partner churches is focused on the training of lay and clergy leaders for the growing number of the two denominations' (Disciples of Christ and United Church of Christ) congregations.

The long-term goals are to develop a network of support for new mission service projects and further collaboration in areas such as the joint ordination of pastors. Helping develop new funding sources, helping congregations heighten their experience of what it means to be "church" and be in covenant with other congregations are current emphases of its work.

KALAUMAN CENTER

As a community-based center in Dumaguete City, Philippines, the Dumaguete Kalauman Center for Development (Kalauman), whose name means "from where you can draw hope", spreads God's love through holistic services and programs, including educational programs, health services, and Christian education, with family and community engagement opportunities.

Grace and her family participate in the Global Ministries Child Sponsorship program at Kalauman. Grace is 8 years old and attends public school where she is in Second Grade. She was an honor student in Grade 1 and described by her teacher as having great potential towards achieving her dreams. She has a positive attitude and does her school work with great skill. She has one sister and one brother.

She lives in a house without its own source of electricity or water. The father works in construction when opportunities are available. Her mother has a difficult time finding work, because she only has an elementary school education. They came from the countryside hoping to find a better life in Dumaguete City.

Kalauman walks together with families, like Grace's family, and provides practical, holistic services to enable opportunities for a brighter future.
