## Church Building Sale Update

After more than a year on the market, we are now able to announce that our church building has been sold! We have a signed contract, which both attorneys have approved, and now we can begin the work of preparing to close on the property.

The offer is a full price (\$299,000) cash offer, so there is no financing to be approved from the buyer. The buyers are a couple from Indiana who say that they plan to renovate part of the church to create a residence for themselves.

There are legal matters to be taken care of, of course. We must commission a search and survey of the property, which should take a month or so. We also have to petition the New York State Supreme Court for permission to sell the property, which is required by law for a non-profit organization. We don't have an exact date, but we expect to close sometime in late July or early August.



In the meantime, we will be searching for a new church home. Our goal is to find a building or space to lease, at least initially, where we can continue to worship, meet, study, and minister to the community – in short, continue all the aspects of our ministry, just from a different location.

While there is certainly a feeling of sadness to be leaving this building where so much of our church history has occurred, this is also an exciting time for us to make a fresh start and continue our long history of ministry to our members, the community of Lockport, and the world.

When we get closer to the time for moving, we will be holding a special service to de-commission the building and celebrate the ministry that has been done here. Watch for details about that. We will keep you updated in the Weekly Vine and through Sunday announcements.

Celebrating

UCC Firsts

Growing up, my parents always celebrated the many milestones of "firsts" of my siblings and I: our first word, our first steps, our first tooth, our first haircut, our first day of school, our first birthday, our first imaginary friend, our first communion, and many many many more! It is meaningful and memorable to celebrate "firsts" in life, in church, and in the world.

Because of this, the UCC loves to celebrate "firsts" in ministry. It was the United Church of Christ that was **the first** historically white denomination to ordain an African-American (1785), **the first** to ordain a woman (1853), **the first** to ordain an openly gay man (1972), and **the first** Christian church to affirm the right of same-gender couples to marry (2005). But wait . . . there is more!! This year (2023-2024) was a year of "firsts" for the denomination!!

It is quite historic to be able to be present and participate in the making of milestones in the church. In 2023, I had the privilege of attending General Synod, and I had the privilege and pleasure to be part of the election of **the first** woman of African descent called to serve as the General Minister and President of the UCC (2023). But wait . . . there is more! At the UCCNY Annual Meeting (2024), I had the privilege and pleasure to be part of the installation of Rev. Dr. Marsha Williams, who is **the first** black woman to serve as our NY Conference Minister!

But wait . . . there is more! In 2024, two local churches had the opportunity to make a ministry "first" possible for me. It was all of you at Epiphany UCC and Lockport UCC that decided to share a pastor together! But wait . . . there is more! With Lockport and Epiphany, I was able to celebrate more firsts: my first foot/handwashing, my first Maundy Thursday service, my first prayer vigil, my first pride festival, and my first church wide devotional project!

Let us continue to celebrate "firsts" in ministry together at Epiphany UCC and Lockport UCC. But wait . . . there is more!! With God's help, we can make many more "ministry first milestones" together!! Thanks be to God. Amen!

Just select a God-name that inspires you. There are name suggestions on cards in the narthex at church, but if you can't get to church, or have a different one in mind that's okay. If you do not live in the area, we'd still love to have you participate - just email your devotional to Cyndy or mail it to the church. We are re-printing here all the details and the example from last month's newsletter.

### A God of Many Names Devotional

If we were to go on a little journey through the Bible, we would discover that there is not just one name for God. In the Bible, God has MANY names!! God is described as a Parent, Midwife, Judge, Teacher, Lord, Guide, Friend – to name a few! In the Bible, the names for God are all verbs. This means that all the names of God describe something that God DOES in our world. We can know God by what God has DONE, is DOING, and will DO in the future.

Because we all experience God in different ways, we might connect with God more as a Helper than as a Potter, or more as Savior than as a Caretaker, or more as Liberator than as Physician. You might already have a special name for God – a name that helps you connect with God, a name you use in your prayer, or a name that deepens your understanding with God. Each week in worship, we use a different name for God based on the scripture that day. Together, we have learned about God Our Advocate, God Our Friend, and the Out of the Box God. But as you can imagine, there are many more names for God that can draw us into deeper understanding and relationship with God.

As one way (of many) to grow spiritually as a church, God has led me to dream up writing a devotional together, as an out of the box way to grow together as a church. Let's write a devotional together!! In this devotional, you each would choose a name for God that means a lot to you or that matters to you or that makes it possible for you to know God better – and write a brief devotional article about it. And after we collect the articles from our members, we will put them all together in a devotional book to read together as a church. In this way, we will be able to get to know one another better and get to know God better too! On Sunday, there will be a bunch of index cards with a name for God on it. You are invited to choose one of the index cards with a name on it. And you will write your devotional article on that name.

If you are interested in being a part of this church-wide project, please see below for some guidelines for the devotional article:

- ▲ Length: 200-300 words (not including scripture reference)
- ∠ Include a bible verse that uses/describes your chosen name for God
- ∠ Include a reflection on the scripture and name of God
- ∠ Include a simple prayer

It seems important to share an example of a devotional article that I had written in the past so that you can get a better understanding of what a devotional article can be like. This devotional example (found on the following page) is about the "journeys" in the bible and what they teach us about God.

Please let Pastor Hope know if you are interested in this church-wide project!! It is a way to share our faith and our stories with one another!! Thanks be to God. Amen!

We would like to have all of the devotional articles collected by the end of August, so we can assemble them and create our devotional book. So think about what name you would like to choose and start writing your devotional article. (When complete, it would be very helpful if you can submit your devotional to Cyndy via email if possible – but hard copies are OK, too.)

#### Re-HOME GENESIS 12:1-5

Now the LORD said to Abram, "Go from your country and your kindred and your father's house to the land that I will show you. I will make of you a great nation, and I will bless you, and make your name great, so that you will be a blessing. I will bless those who bless you, and the one who curses you I will curse; and in you all the families of the earth shall be blessed." So Abram went, as the LORD had told him; and Lot went with him. Abram was seventy-five years old when he departed from Haran. Abram took his wife Sarai and his brother's son Lot, and all the possessions that they had gathered, and the persons whom they had acquired in Haran; and they set forth to go to the land of Canaan.

#### REFLECTION

As one of the first sojourn stories in the Bible, the calling of God to Abram and Sarai to GO from their home to a new HOME in the land of Canaan reminds us that sometimes we are called to travel to a new destination to call home throughout our lives. For Abram and Sarai, the re-homing experience was full of possibility and promise, for God established a covenant with them to make them a nation of blessing to the world. In our travels, oftentimes we find that many different places can FEEL like home to us. When we talk about these places, we call them our HOME AWAY FROM HOME. At these homes away from home, we feel safe, comforted, and an overwhelming sense of belonging in this place. Do you have a place that you feel to be your home away from home? Take some time and reflect upon how you feel in your home away from home, whenever you visit it.

#### PRAYER

Home-making God, you have created the cosmos as your dwelling place, your home. Because you are a homemaking God, you have blessed us with a HOME on earth. We thank you for our HOME and our HOMES AWAY FROM HOME, and yet we recognize that there are many in our midst who do not have a home or a home away from home. Together, we pray for an end to homelessness in our world. We are called to action and commit to acts of compassion, advocacy and policy making, and collaborating with community organizations that provides support to unhoused persons in our world. Amen.
