

## Pastoral Pondering . . .

Likewise, the Spirit helps us in our weakness, for we do not know how to pray as we ought, but the Spirit intercedes with groanings too deep for words. (Romans 8:26)



No words. There are times in our lives when we have no words to respond to what is going on around us. Whether it was a crisis or an unexpected diagnosis or a traumatic experience, there are times in our lives that rob us of words, times when we do not know what to say, and times when no words can be uttered.

In the days following the inauguration of the current administration, so many unexpected things have happened that have left me speechless. As the pastor of two purple churches (churches with a mix of blue voters and red voters and everyone in between), it is likely that the onslaught of rapid-fire executive orders, abrupt change of policies, and unexpected changes has caused many – if not all – of us to feel overwhelmed and rendered speechless, no matter where our personal political affiliation lies. If you are feeling like this, know that you are not alone. It is something that our spiritual ancestors struggled with too. In writing to our spiritual ancestors and to us, Paul the Apostle offers some comfort

when we have no words, when we do not know what to say, and when we find ourselves speechless. It is the Spirit of God that dwells within us that speaks on our behalf through wordless groaning. The groaning of the Spirit of God in us is too deep to express in words.

Too deep for words. When we have no words, God does. But the groaning of God is too deep to articulate in words. Words cannot express the deep sense of sorrow in God when suffering is found on every corner of the globe. In other words, God is so grieved by what is going on in the world that even God is rendered speechless. Instead of words, God's own grief is expressed in wordless groans.

Church, God is grieved by what is happening in our families, in our neighborhoods, in our communities, in our nation, and in our world. Do you hear the wordless groans of God in response to the dismantling of all social safety nets and the loss of jobs and the loss of equal rights and the loss of federal funding and the loss of love? Let those with ears, hear what God is saying. The wordless groans of God are deafening, and joins with our own speechlessness at what is happening all around us.

Lest we despair, the Spirit of God is present in us to help us. Because God's own heart is grieved by what is happening to us, God is offering to help us to make things right. And know this: God will! Take heart, Church. God knows what is happening to us and knows what to do about it. Go to God in prayer always . . . but especially when you have no words.

## Congregational Vote to Call Pastor Hope

#### March 16

In January of 2024 the Church Council entered into an agreement with Hope Schwartz (now Rev. Schwartz) for her to be our **Designated Pastor** for a term of one year. She started her tenure with us on April 1, 2024.

The time has flown by! With Pastor Hope we have settled into our new church home, and worshiped together. We've had a



chance to get to know her, and she's gotten to know us.

We are approaching the end of that one-year agreement, and now is time for the congregation to vote on the question of **Calling Rev. Schwartz to be our Settled, Permanent Pastor**.

On March 16, following our morning worship service, we will hold a congregational meeting. Everyone will have an opportunity to discuss the issues and express any comments, concerns or questions. Following that discussion, our members will vote on the question to call. Pastor Hope will not be present for the meeting, as is always the custom when taking a call vote.

We encourage all of our members to be present for this important meeting. Friends are invited to be part of the discussion as well.




#### \* Stories of the Light \*

**Orfelina Portillo** is an agricultural technician working with families in northern Honduras. She teaches sustainable approaches to growing crops; monitors water projects; shows women in the community how to prepare more nutritious meals for their families; and leads workshops for things like creating organic fertilizers and sprays. Orfelina proclaims, "This is what I am passionate about: teaching. My profession is a very important part of my everyday life. My work is my joy...I am part of the strong hand that feeds the world."

**The Council of Churches in Sierra Leone** (CCSL) has made significant strides in empowering women and supporting communities through transformative programs. Serving approximately one million church members and nearly three million beneficiaries annually, CCSL is committed to breaking barriers and promoting women's leadership across various sectors.

The YWCA of Palestine, a United Church of Christ partner through Global Ministries and supported by One Great Hour of Sharing, has engaged local Palestinian communities since 1893. Today, it offers programs of economic empowerment, women's rights, youth leadership, and children's education. An example of the latter is the YWCA's nursery schools and kindergartens in refugee camps, schools the YWCA has run for decades. In addition to regular classes, the YWCA offers skill-based camps such as photography and sports, as well as other extra-curricular activities at its schools.





Our faith teaches us that transgender, nonbinary, and intersex people are beloved children of God. Recently, this community has come under attack by our federal government. Banned from serving in the military and fired from positions in the federal government. Prohibited from playing on school sports teams. Unable to get passports that reflect their gender identity. Cut off from lifesaving, gender-affirming care.

We are barely two months into 2025 and there have already been 339 anti-trans proposed laws at the state level across the nation. Every day, members of this beloved community wake up to more devastation. The people who love them are mourning. As people of faith, we must act! It is time to:

1) Tell Congress to investigate and block all the attacks on trans, nonbinary, and intersex people that are currently underway across the federal government, including the firing of federal government workers who work on issues of gender and sexuality and the State Department refusing to process gender changes to passports. If an agency or department is found to be violating U.S. law, the Constitution, or civil and individual rights, Congress has the constitutional duty to ensure, through robust investigation, the government corrects course.

2) Urge Congress to re-introduce the Equality Act, a first step towards passage. This law would provide protection from discrimination based on sexual orientation and/or gender identity. 70% of Americans support the Equality Act. While the Equality Act has been introduced several times in recent years, it has not yet been signed into law. If we are to live into our ideal of equality for all, the entire LGBTQ+ community must be protected against discrimination.

Let us work together for a world where all children of God are cherished, protected, and free to be their beautiful selves. As people of faith, we must be loud and clear in our message that trans individuals are beloved by God, are created in the image of God, and are deserving of dignity and equal protection under the law.

Contacting your Representative and Senators in Washington CAN make a difference. Send a letter or email, or make a phone call to let them know your feelings on this issue. If they are not supporting the policies in line with your views, urge them to do so. If you are happy with the policies they are pursuing, let them know you agree and urge them to keep fighting! And don't forget your representatives at the State level. Laws and policies in the States can make a difference, too.

## Crisis Fund Launched to Help Local Refugee Aid Programs

The Refugee Partnership of Western New York has launched a \$1.5 million Crisis Response Fund to help local refugee resettlement agencies continue their work in the wake of President Trump suspending the U.S. Refugee Admissions Program and its associated funding.

The money will allow the organizations – Catholic Charities of Buffalo, International Institute of Buffalo, Jericho Road Community Health Center, Jewish Family Services of Western New York, and Journey's End Refugee Services – to press on with assisting 731 refugees who have arrived in the region within the last 90 days.

When refugees are accepted into the United States after being vetted by the federal government, they are promised three months of support, which includes assistance with housing, food, clothing, health care, and finding employment, among other things. The federal government gives money to resettlement agencies to help newly arrived refugees.

Five local foundations have already given \$450,000 to kickstart the campaign. The Refugee Partnership's goal is to raise the balance within 30 days so they can continue to assist these refugees now that government funding has been cut off.
